## **ANTI-BULLYING POLICY**

### **Statement**

We believe that every member of the school community has the right to come to school without the fear of physical, verbal or psychological intimidation.

### **Aims:**

- Increase the awareness of all staff of strategies for recognising and tackling bullying.
- Sustain an ethos amongst students which disapproves of and dissuades bullying.
- Ensure that staff create an atmosphere of mutual respect in the classroom and themselves avoid intimidating tactics.
- Encourage students to speak out and report bullying incidents.
- Reassure victims so that they are not made to feel inadequate and are given concrete help, advice and support.
- Ensure that staff and students recognise harassment (including racial, sexual and other protected characteristics) as potential bullying and treat it accordingly, maintaining appropriate confidentiality.
- Make bullies aware that their behaviour is unacceptable and provide counselling to enable them to change their behaviour, implementing sanctions as appropriate.
- Ensure adequate supervision is maintained throughout the school day both in and out of the classroom.
- Make all staff of any specific issues regarding anti-bullying support for students with SEND (Special Educational Needs and/or Disabilities).

### **Implementation:**

- Highlight areas of school where bullying is most likely to occur and to ensure that these are adequately checked by duty staff.
- Use curricular intervention to help prevent bullying by including topics related to bullying in P.S.H.E., English and Drama lessons and tutorial programmes.
- Bring bullying 'out into the open' by making it a topic which can be discussed, and to provide information through leaflets, posters, on-line resources, assemblies and tutorial work.
- Inform new entrants and their parents of the school policy regarding anti-bullying.
- Make use of senior students as Peer Mentors
- Provide training for Peer Mentors and to increase numbers being trained
- Maintain a log of bullying incidents specific to different modes of bullying e.g. racist, homophobic, cyber
