Welcome to the first edition of the Montgomery Learning Bulletin, which will be issued to the parents and carers of all our students on a half termly schedule.

The idea of the bulletin is to keep you informed about the various educational developments that will have a significant impact on your child's learning and progress.

This first addition will focus on the changes to be made to the GCSE grading system that will come into effect from 2017. It's vital information that all parents and students need to know.

New GCSEs in English language, English Literature and maths are currently being taught at Montgomery and were started in September, 2015. Current Year 11 students will get these results in August, 2017 in the form of a number grade, not as a letter grade. The same will apply to all other new GCSE courses in the August of 2018. This will, firstly, concern our current Year 10 students.

Overleaf you will find a diagram that will help you to convert current letter grades into future number grades. The most important thing to remember is; that to be sure of securing the equivalent of a current "C" grade, a student will need to attain a grade 5. This is aiming high, which is what we expect of all our students.

Both teachers and students will soon have to get used to using these grades to measure student progress. Students will be told if they are on target to achieve a grade 4+.
